1. INTRODUCTION



CBP is a form of participatory planning which has been designed to promote community action. CBP establishes a participatory process for mobilising communities and planning around grassroots issues and how they (issues) can relate to the broader municipal planning perspective. The CBP process is a forerunner to the IDP.

Ward 03 is situated to the east of Jozini town the majority of the land belongs to the Ingonyama Trust (Traditional authority areas). The area is predominantly rural and underdeveloped. Ward 03 is approximately 15 000 ha.

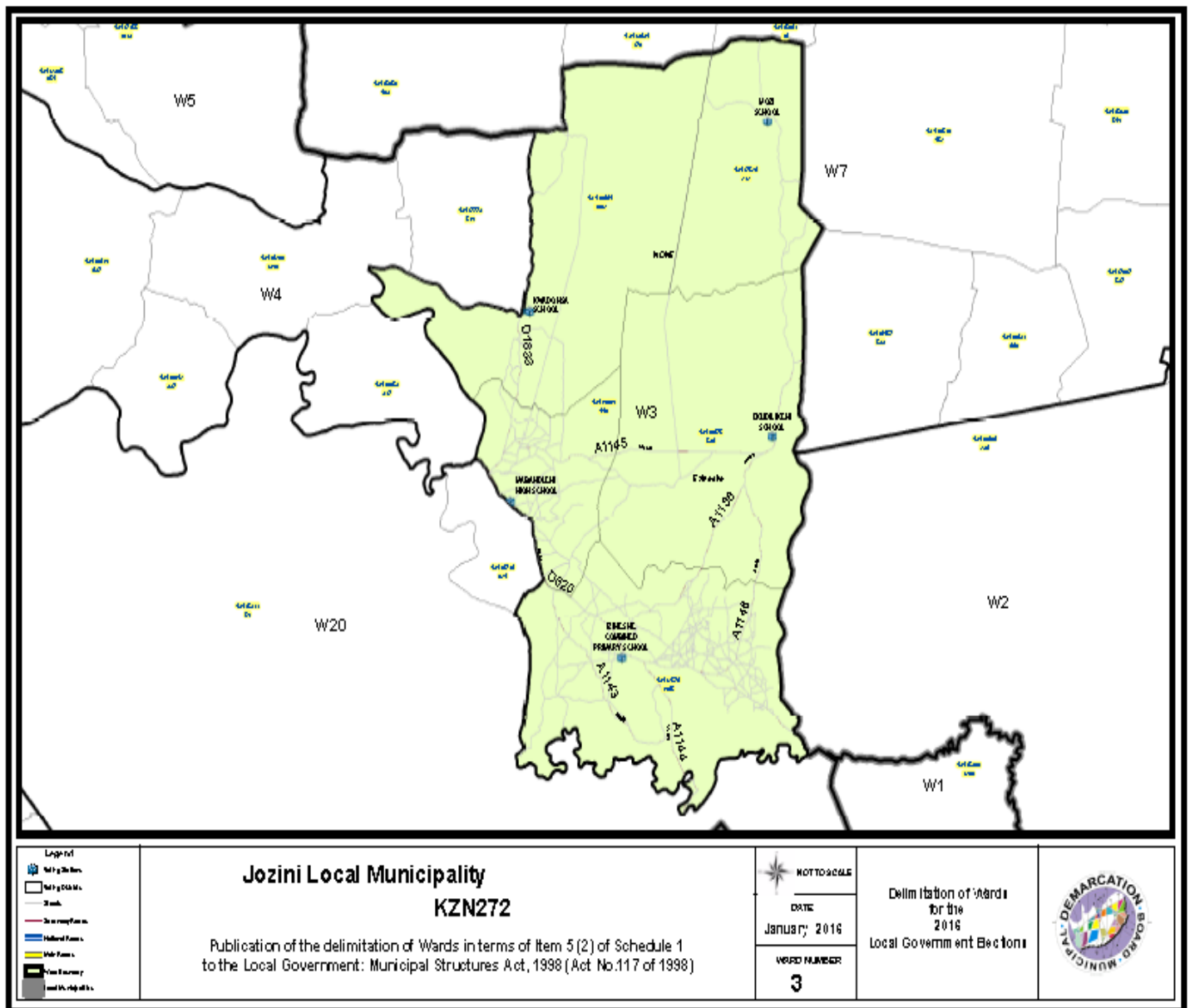
